SUMMARY

To satisfy a Department of Environmental Quality regarding the Little Luckiamute River/Watershed Total Daily Maximum Load of allowable pollutants entering the waters, participation in the Tree City USA program was highly encouraged. A requirement of the program is to hold an Arbor Day Celebration each year.

The City would like to have a set date each year for Arbor Day and get the community more involved in the event.

BACKGROUND**PREVIOUS COMMITTEE ACTION**

The 2018 Solve event yielded approximately 20 volunteers. Debris volume collected is unknown. It was decided to have the Solve/Arbor Day event on Saturday, September 29, 2018 in conjunction with National Volunteer Day held by religious entities.

It was noted by Committee Member Anzalone that another date would be better as turnout was very low.

ALTERNATIVES/FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS N/A

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends Solve to be a separate event from Arbor Day. Staff also recommends Arbor Day move to a City coordinated event. Traditionally Arbor Day is held annually on the fourth Friday of April. Oregon Arbor week is held the first week in April. Staff recommends holding one of these dates permanently so citizens can be prepared and participate.

SUMMARY

Public participation was essential in the development of the Parks Master Plan. The Parks and Recreation Committee and staff utilized surveys, newsletter articles, public meetings, Falls City website and the Parks Master Plan Open House to successfully collaborate with the goal of achieving better and more acceptable decisions.

BACKGROUND

Committee sent surveys asking residents to help prioritize the needs of the parks. The survey identified 5 priorities. Priority 1 - Site built public restrooms connected to city sewer at each park. The Parks and Recreation Committee identified restrooms as the number 1 priority to resolve public health concerns, improve community livability and protect the Luckiamute Watershed. Priority 2 – Little Luckiamute River Trail (Appendix A-2), Priority 3 – Michael Harding Memorial Park North park Pavilion (Appendix A-1), Priority 4 – Campground at George Kitchin Park, and Priority 5 – City Hall Open Space Simple Amphitheater (Appendix A-3). ALTERNATIVES/FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The challenge for the Falls City Park System is lack of funding resulting from limited General Fund revenues. This deficit is coupled with a minimal depth of staffing for park operations and maintenance (O &M). Volunteer efforts over the years have substantially contributed for park improvements by donation of money, materials, and labor; this type of generosity will continue to be important in years to come. It will be a requirement to estimate operations and maintenance (O&M) when considering park improvements.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Create a Parks Improvements Reserve Fund to account for money raised through donations, fundraisers and new revenue sources.

SUMMARY**BACKGROUND**

In September, City Manager Cortshell requested the Parks Committee research street trees to line N. Main St. Part of being a Tree City USA participant required the City to belong to the Arbor Day Foundation. The Arbor Day Foundation offers a large variety of trees and shrubs for purchase. Recently staff received a pamphlet of available items with discounted pricing for members.

1-2 foot Crape Myrtles are available for \$6.00 each at regular cost and \$3.98 to members. The Arbor Day Foundation also offers a free 3-4 foot Red Maple to members for supporting the Foundation with a flat \$9.95 shipping fee per order. The pamphlet is available at City Hall for viewing and ordering.

PREVIOUS COMMITTEE ACTION

At the October 17, 2018 Parks and Recreation Committee meeting, Committee members discussed street trees to line N. Main St. Committee agreed Crape Myrtles would be a nice addition. Jill Anzalone was assigned to research donations of trees and or cost.
